Key Facts and Information

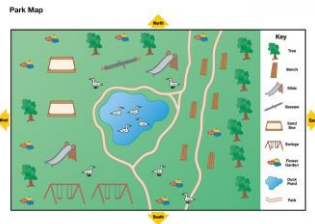
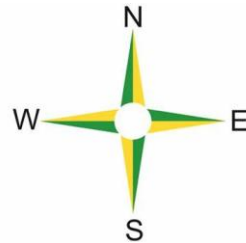
Our school is in Taunton, England.

Vocabulary

School	A place where children go to learn.
School Grounds	The outside area linked to a school including playground, field etc.
Map	A representation of a place or area.
Key	A set of symbols with their meaning.
Physical features	Naturally occurring features e.g seas, mountains, rivers.
Human features	Features that humans have created e.g. roads, bridges, houses.
Landmarks	An object or feature that is important in an area.
Fieldwork	Observing, collecting data and measuring things to answer questions.
Symbols	A picture to represent something.
Compass directions	North, South, East and West.
Direction	The way someone needs to move to get somewhere.
