Do You have Learning Zones in your classroom? How important are these to help you learn?

- ✓ Yes, we have them. They are important as they show the teacher what we struggle with and what we still need to learn.
- ✓ They are very important to show what to do if you find something hard or challenging.
- ✓ It is very important it helps us know if it is right or wrong.

Do you talk about moving and blocking behaviours in Class?

- ✓ Movers mean we help others to learn and use helpful talk.
- ✓ Blockers would shout out and not listen and disturb others.
- ✓ Yes it helps us identify the difference between these behaviours which helps learning.
- ✓ I just know about them a friend explained movers and blockers to me in his own words.
- ✓ We talk about blocking behaviours.

What Does it Mean to be a Purple Learner?

- ✓ Purple learners mean if we find things challenging but we don't give up.
- ✓ When we are purple we get some help but mainly work independently.
- ✓ Purple work can be work that is new but not overly challenging.
- ✓ Challenging yourself like in writing.
- ✓ When something is a bit hard and a bit easy to do.
- ✓ It's a mix of learning both hard and easy.
- ✓ If we had no purple learning work would just be too hard or too easy.

Explain what it means to have differences, does this impact on behaviour?

- ✓ Some children with differences might get extra help but it's fair because then they can really show what they know.
- ✓ Children with special needs get special help to support their behaviour.
- ✓ Some children have autism and they might accidentally do something, but other people should help them.
- ✓ Some people struggle with hearing and some struggle with tests.
- ✓ If we were all the same it would be very confusing.
- ✓ Children explained that some behaviours aren't a choice
- ✓ We have lots of differences, it sometimes can affect behaviour, but everyone should treat each other with kindness and respect their differences and feelings.
